A.H.S. Alumni Reunion is Saturday

The annual Arnold High School alumni reunion is set for this Saturday, May 27, and there's lots in store. After individual honored class reunions in the afternoon, alumni from all years will gather in the school's auditorium for the banquet and program to follow.

Serving as 2017 president is Tim Rosentrater, who selected 1974 grad Craig Rosentrater to emcee the program.

Craig, who is the son of Glen and Ruth Rosentrater, attended Grace University in Omaha, Nebraska, and Casper College in Wyoming.

He married Betty Jo Lucas Rosentrater (Class of '71), daughter of Bob and Viola Lucas, in 1978. The couple immediately left Arnold to help Youth for Christ start a group home for troubled boys near Lawrence, Kansas.

In 1981, they moved to Casper, Wyoming, with Youth for Christ, where they raised their family, son Lucas and daughter Amy.

In Wyoming, Craig's ministry focus was working with school and court-referred youth through wilderness backpacking, focus group facilitation in high schools, addictions chap-

lin, mentoring, and as state director, he started peer-led Bible study clubs throughout the state.

In 1999 they moved to Denver, Colorado, to take on national responsibilities and leadership with Youth for Christ/USA. He then became the Executive Director of Denver YFC for seven years and eventually worked with Youth for Christ International, traveling to six continents training, coaching and mentoring indigenous YFC National Directors.

In addition to YFC, Craig also had the opportunity to be the president of Mission Par la Foa in Haiti for six years. He was Executive Director for Christian Solidarity Worldwide (working with the suffering-church), taking him to Russia the first time, as well as becoming a certified international multi-culture executive coach. Probably his most unique responsibility, and one that he thoroughly enjoyed, was revitalizing an 800-acre coffee plantation in Laos for most of 2013 for a North American holding company.

Currently, Craig is the Executive Director of Southern Colorado Youth for Christ, working with incarcerated

youth and developing an effective after-care program for youth transitioning back into community utilizing the local church.

Craig and Jo live in Highlands Ranch, Colorado.

Village Board Accepts Resignations

The Arnold Village Board accepted the resignation of Village Superintendent Bill Moser at a special meeting held on May 15. Moser's last day of employment will be June 8, and the village is currently advertis-

ing to fill the position.

The board also accepted Eileen Moser's resignation as pool manager, which was effective immediately. It was noted that a manager can be hired from the applications previously submitted for the position. Grace Magill was at the meeting and expressed interest in the position. She has worked at the pool for four years and served as assistant manager in 2015 and 2016. After discussion, the board voted to hire Magill as manager for the 2017 season.

Discussion followed on the need for additional lifeguards, with a deadline to apply of May 18 due to lifeguard training starting on May 22. It was noted that Magill has the authority to hire more lifeguards.

DeLosh On The Mend After Roll-Over

Arnold resident Kent DeLosh is back home and recovering after he rolled his '93 Chevy K1500 pickup at the intersection of the Dunning road and Road 806 on Tuesday of last week. Arnold Fire & Rescue was first on the scene, and due to DeLosh's injuries, requested a flight for life helicopter to Great Plains Hospital in North Platte.

According to a report by the Custer County sheriff's office, DeLosh was northbound on the Dunning road when he left the roadway to the right. He then overcorrected and re-entered the roadway in a skid, crossing both lanes of traffic and entered the west side ditch. The vehicle then turned approximately three-quarter of a roll and came to rest on its top. The vehicle was totaled.
