“That is such a great facility for our community. The guys are so nice and accommodating. There was a lot of space, and there were a lot of different conversation groups.”

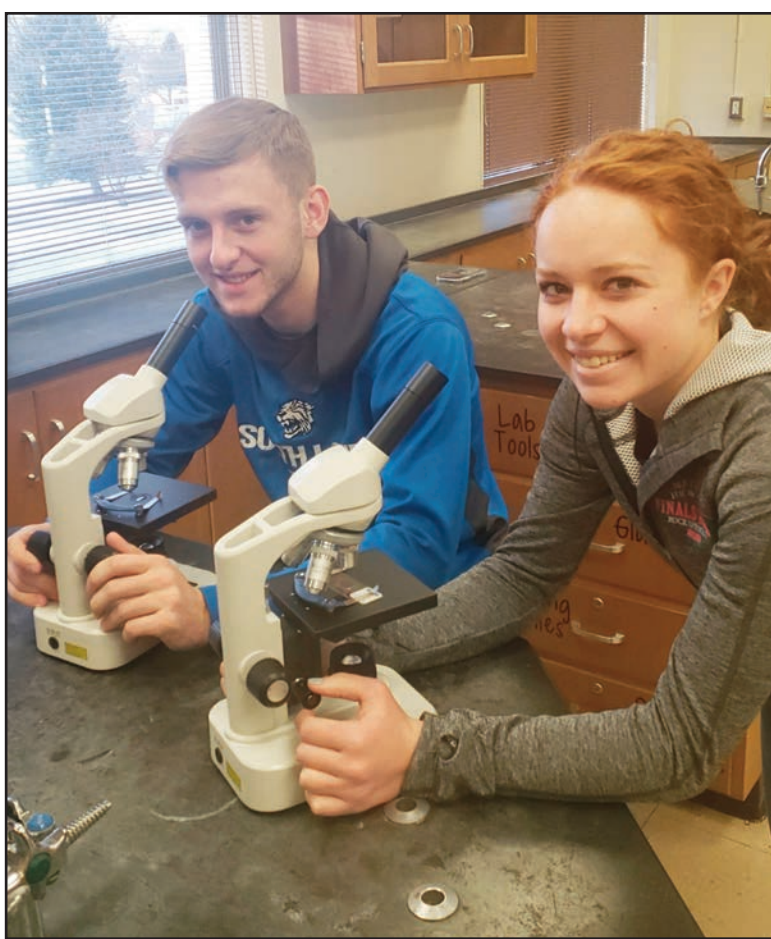
When the movie started at 7:00 p.m., many of the people crossed the street to watch the movie, with SORC board members receiving free passes.

New Microscopes Purchased for Science Lab

Arnold Public Schools has ten new microscopes in use in the science lab.

An Applegate grant provided half the needed amount and the Arnold Booster Club generously offered to cover the other half.

In the grant application, Science teacher Mrs. Sandager said that APS is now offering the opportunity for students to learn more about science through a new anatomy class, in which these microscopes are greatly needed. Unfortunately, new classes are expensive to start, with tools and materials. This project will not only directly benefit the anatomy class but will benefit other biology-based classes such as junior high and the 10th grade biology. An estimated 40 students will use the microscopes in the 2019/2020 school year, along with any future students who join the classes in the following

years.

The Microscope Project will provide the rural students of APS a critical hands-on opportunity to learn a skill that is so very important in any future biology or medical careers. The microscopes will also help increase student engagement and creativity.

“The kids are beyond excited to use the new microscopes and develop skills that they will need if they pursue a career in the science field,” said Mrs. Sandager, whose goal coming in was to update the lab.

It is interesting to note that the lab’s old microscopes were from 1976 and older.

The project was partly supported by funding from the John Russell Applegate Fund for Teachers at Mid-Nebraska Community Foundation, based in North Platte.

“Both myself and the students want to thank the Applegate Fund and the Arnold Booster Club for making it possible to purchase the microscopes, said Mrs. Sandager.

The next goal will be writing up guidelines, by-laws, and a mission statement. April said they have had some instances where those need to be in place.

Along with the traditional events, Chamber will focus more on promoting Chamber businesses and getting their names out there.
