Village Board Reorganizes for New Year

At the December 11 Village Board meeting there were some topics for change, or to remain the same. The appointments for Village officials are the following: Glen Bowers will remain the chairman of the board, Patty Lamberty - clerk/treasurer, Mike Borders dba Borders Law Office - village attorney, Tom Werblow dba T.C. Engineering- village engineer, and Harvey Foran - water commissioner. Chairman Bowers reappointed trustees to the following committees: general (community center, parks and swimming pool) and streets and solid waste - Aaron Olson and Scott McDowell; electric, water and sewer- Brent Kulp and Tim Turley.

The Arnold Sentinel was designated as the official newspaper for publications of all the village business.

Bowers, Interim Village Superintendent Doug DeLaune and Dell Cerny were appointed to the board of health. Bowers also volunteered to remain the village representative to the Arnold Economic Development Corporation. Diana Coleman was reappointed to the housing authority board for a term of five years.

Ken Wehrman, whose term on the citizen advisory committee expires this month, was reappointed to the committee. The committee is a “watch dog” committee and not a committee that plays a role in the decision-making process in regard to where economic development finds are spent. Bowers volunteers to remain the ex-officio member for the committee.
