Can Actual Spring Be Far Away?

As of this issue, the first day of spring is just seven days away, and residents are more than ready after a very harsh winter of scooping snow and enduring extreme low temps. Fall wasn’t bad, but then winter really kicked in.

Following is a summary of snowfall amounts and highs and lows since October according to the National Weather Service in North Platte:

October: High 88/low 15; new snow 5”.

November: High 64/low 8; new snow 8”.

December: High 46; low -3; new snow 24”.


January: High 60/low -2; new snow 4 inches.

February: High 60/low -16; new snow 16”. (February recorded one day that was 23 degrees above normal, and another that was 36 degrees below normal.)

Eight more inches of snow fell on Thursday, March 7.

The forecast for the week calls for blizzard conditions Wednesday through Thursday.


Dawson Hanna-Miles received a 4th place award in Photography with his photo titled “Full Circle.”

Scholastic Art Awards

Each year, the Alliance partners with more than 100 visual arts and literary arts organizations across the country to bring the Scholastic Awards to local communities. Teens in

grades 7-12 (ages 13 and up) apply in 29 categories of art and writing. In 2018, students submitted nearly 350,000 works of art and writing to the Scholastic Awards.

Submissions are juried by luminaries in the visual and literary arts, some of whom are past award recipients.

Gold Key works are judged nationally by an impressive panel of creative-industry experts to receive National Medals, including Gold Medals and Silver Medals. National Medalists are recognized in part at the National Ceremony at Carnegie Hall in New York City.

Lyndee Rogers’ “Double Vision” photo won a Gold Key in the Scholastic Art & Writing competition, and will now be

judged at the National level.

Dawson Hanna-Miles received a Silver Key for his “Full Circle” Photography entry.

Cooper Atkins received Honorable Mention in Photography with his photo titled “Work Horse.”

Cecilia Wonch received two Honorable Mentions for her water color painting titled “Gingerly” and a colored drawing titled “Warrior Steed.”


