ARNOLD, Nebraska — March is Red Cross Month, and for more than 130 years, heroic American Red Cross volunteers have provided hope and urgent relief to families in communities across the country.

This March the community is invited to join in the lifesaving mission of the Red Cross and be someone's hero by rolling up a sleeve to give blood Monday, March 15, 2021 from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. at the Arnold Community Center. According to the Red Cross, someone in the U.S. needs blood every two seconds to respond to patient emergencies. Accident and burn victims, heart surgery and organ transplant patients, and those receiving treatment for leukemia, cancer or sickle cell disease may all require blood. All blood types are needed.

Loup Basin COVID Update

Burwell, NE — As of Monday, February 22nd, 2,376 COVID-19 cases have been reported by Loup Basin Public Health Department (LBPHD). Due to the low case counts in recent weeks, LBPHD has decreased its frequency to a weekly update to the public on their website (www.lbphd.org) and social media (Facebook & Instagram).

On Saturday, February 27th, the FDA granted it is third Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) for a coronavirus vaccine. The Johnson & Johnson product is the first COVID-19 vaccine to be a single dose vaccination.

With the approval, LBPHD anticipates an increasing amount of vaccine allocation for the 9-county district. The Health Department encourages everyone, no matter what vaccine priority group they are in, to register via <https://vaccinate.ne.gov>. If you do not have access to the internet, individuals may call the DHSS COVID hotline (833)998-2275 to be assisted with the registration process.

As of February 27th, LBPHD and its vaccine partners have administered 7,532 COVID-19 vaccines. Of the total, 5,171 (69%) are first doses and 2,361 (31%) are second doses.

John Holman Receives 2020 Breeder of the Year Award

Former Arnold resident John Holman now of Clay Center, Nebraska, was recently selected as the Breeder of the Year for Herding Events for 2020 by the American Kennel Club. This award is given annually to only one breeder from the 42 breeds recognized by the AKC as herding breeds.

This award is based on John's long term commitment to the sport of herding and the number of dogs that John has produced that have obtained the Herding Excellent (HX) and Herding Champion (HC) titles. HX and HC are the highest level

of competition within the AKC herding program.

John and his wife Natalie started raising and training Border Collies in 1982 and expanded into the AKC program in 1994 where John is a noted judge of herding events. Their travels have taken them all over the lower 48 states, Alaska, and Sweden.

The Breeder of the Year Awards are given by the AKC Performance Event Division of which herding is a part. The award states in part: "the AKC wishes to acknowledge those individuals that have excelled

in breeding dogs that have proven to be outstanding in AKC sports. The commitment to preserve, protect, and improve a breed represents the very essence of the AKC. The Breeder of The Year Award is given to outstanding individuals who have dedicated themselves to improving the health, temperament and performance of dogs in a given sport."

John has always bred his Border Collies to reach this high standard and continues to compete in all types of herding events.
