## RT Gets a \$3,000 Haircut at SORC Winter Party

Proceeds split 50/50 between Fall Festival and Fire Department

After the SORC Winter party, RT Green (pictured with festival co-organizers Della Dailey and Robin Smith) sported a crazy clipper haircut for about two weeks before getting it detailed. The haircut raised a total of \$3,000.00 at auction - half going to the upcoming Fall Festival and half to the AVFD.

An auction at the Sandhills Open Road Challenge Winter Meeting held at Lincoln on February 12 resulted in a surprise financial bonus for both the Arnold Fall Festival and Arnold Fire Department.

Arnold driver RT Green came up with the idea of putting a haircut up for auction to help this year's fall festival. The members agreed to let him hold the auction with the understanding that half of the proceeds would be going to the fire department for emergency equipment and the remaining 50 percent could be used for festival expenses.

"I thought maybe I'd be able to raise \$400.00 to \$500.00 for the haircut. Well, the guys teamed up and the bid ended at a total of \$3,000.00," said RT.

Several of the guys were in on the bidding, including Robbi Smith, Joe Shown, Chad Christensen, John Schmidt, Denny Powell, Lyle Ekberg, and Alex Varney (and maybe a couple of

others). A couple of the bidders took a pass through RT's hair with the clippers.

RT rocked his messy clipper haircut for two weeks before having Makenna fix it at Four County Boutique. He was in need. He admits not having had a haircut since September of 2021.

With the 50/50 split, the Arnold Festival committee will now be assured that there will be a bouncy house, and money will be available for the rock wall and Redneck Olympics.

As an additional fundraiser, Fall Festival t-shirts were sold at the Chili Cook-off last Saturday, and can still be purchased by contacting RT. The cost is a suggested donation of \$25.00.

Chili Cook-off participants were also given the chance to vote on this year's festival theme, and the winner was: "80's Slogans."

A date of September 17, 2022, has been set for the festival.

went to Cam Meyer. EMT of the Year was awarded to Andrew Tickle and Runner-up EMT of the Year was Cassy DeLosh.

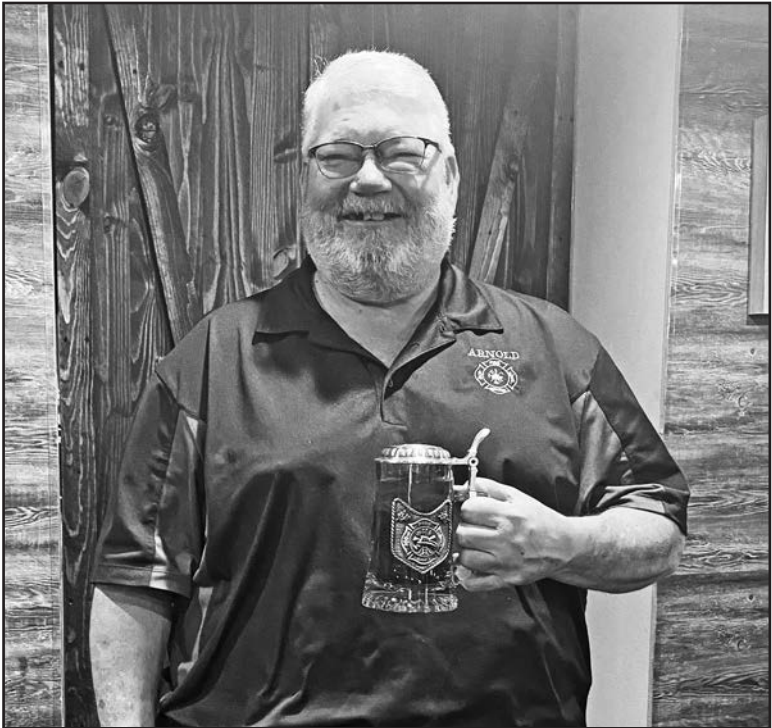
Retired fire department members that were in attendance were John Phillips and Nancy Cool.
